Are you considering a job in academia? If so, there are several things you should know about the application process.

This Friday the AMS Graduate Chapter is sponsoring a panel discussion on applying for academic jobs. We will talk about such topics as putting together the different pieces of an application (e.g., cover letter, CV, research statement, teaching statement, letters of recommendation), how to submit applications, the interview process and timeline, and the different kinds of schools and jobs that exist in academia.

We will have a panel of six professors: Dr. Mark Tomforde, Dr. William Ott, Dr. Vaughn Climenhaga, Dr. Daniel Onofrei, Dr. Zachary Kilpatrick, and Dr. Mark Hubenthal. We will start with Dr. Tomforde summarizing the application process in a 10-minute presentation, and then open up the panel for questions from the audience. We are scheduling 90 minutes for the discussion so that we will have adequate time to address all questions and comments.

This event will be useful for graduate students at all stages of the program, from first-year students to students currently on the academic market. We hope everyone who is planning an academic career, or even considering one, will attend!
