Online Proctored Exam with CASA Monitor – Rules MATH 2331

The following proctored exam rules are the basic rules for "closed book" exams.

Test environment rules

- 1. If possible, take the test in a room where you are alone.
- 2. The lighting in the room must be bright enough to be considered "daylight" quality.
- 3. You must sit at a clean desk or table. The desk, walls around, etc., must not have any writing remove any unauthorized materials that could help you over 6 feet from the testing area. Remove from the testing area, or the area that is visible to the webcam, anything that reveals private information that you do not want to share, or is potentially offensive.
- 4. The room must be as quiet as possible.
- 5. The following items must not be on your desk or used during your proctored exam
 - Books, printed notes
 - Paper (other than the blank scratch sheets for the exam)
 - Calculators
 - Textbooks
 - Notebooks
 - Phones (during the test taking period)
 - Smart Watches
 - Tablets

The computer you use to take the test

- 1. The computer you are using to take the exam must not have more than one display or monitor. For example, if you usually use a laptop with a monitor connected, disconnect your monitor and use only the laptop screen. Casa Monitor requires you to have the Chrome or Edge browsers, so if you do not have those please download them now.
- 2. You must close all programs or windows/tabs on your testing computer and before you begin the exam.
 - a. Close all email applications.
 - b. Close all any messaging systems (Skype, Teams, etc.).
 - c. Close any screen capture applications.
 - d. Close all running applications.
- 3. You must not use applications, including email, messaging, screen-sharing, virtual machines, and remote desktops.
- 4. You must not access files stored on your computer.
- 5. You must not go to non-specified websites.
- 6. You have to give permission to start your computer webcam and allow the video to be sent to the CASA Archive.
- 7. You have to give permission to share your entire computer screen and allow the screenshots to be sent to the CASA Archive.

- 8. You must not use print or capture screen content.
- 9. You must not copy and paste anything to or from an assessment.
- 10. During the entire test try to `aim' your computer so that the webcam can see as much of the testing area as possible.

Your behavior

- 1. You must dress as though you were in a public setting.
- 2. You must not use headphones, earbuds, or any other type of listening equipment.
- 3. You must not communicate with any other person by any means.
- 4. You must not use a phone during the test.
- 5. You must not leave the room during the exam for any reason.

Important: If an unexpected event happens during the test that might cause your video to be flagged, please provide an explanation to your instructor via email after the exam ends so that he/she is aware of the reason behind that behavior while reviewing the exam video.
