Project Submission and Presentations:

Project Submission:

The semester project will be due on April 27 by 11:59 PM. Please submit either in hard copy (obviously during class time at the latest), or through email by that time.

I have intentionally left a great deal about these projects vague so that you can answer the question posed to you in a manner you feel is best for you. (If you want to provide a lot of diagrams versus a lot of text versus a lot of computations, etc.) You do not need to submit all your raw data, just your report. Make certain you answer the question that is being asked in the project.

Project Presentations:

Projects 1, 2, and 3 will present on Monday, April 25.

Projects 4, 5 and 6 will present on Wednesday, April 27.

I will be sending out information about who was assigned to each project so that you have an opportunity to be in contact with others in your group. <u>[Downloadable File, Click Here]</u> The presentation itself will simply involve explaining what the purpose of your project was, how you worked with this particular task and what kind of results you uncovered. (Since you were all working on your project, it is not required that you all results are in agreement with one another.) Essentially, you are our resident expert in this particular area, so you get to inform us of what you figured out.

Some things that are needed in the presentation: Each of you should introduce yourselves by name. Each of you should have some opportunity to speak during the presentation (speaking does not need to be shared equally, but we should hear everyone's voice). Other than that, this is your chance to show off.

Project Feedback:

While other groups are presenting, you are to be an engaged audience. Ask and answer questions. Say things like "Would you mind elaborating on that?" or "Why did you decide on that approach?" I will be providing on online form that each of you must fill out for each group presentation (other than your own) so the presenters have a chance to see all the feedback and comments for them. You must provide feedback to each group, and you have the option to provide individual group members feedback in addition to this. Your comments will only be visible to myself and the group (or individual) they are directed to. They will be anonymous to everyone except myself.

This is not meant to be an opportunity to harass, belittle, verbally assault, or badger the presenters. Anything posted to that effect will be treated the same as if you said it in person. I expect nothing less than you to be professional and pleasant.

Personally, I am looking forward to seeing the work you all did, and I hope you are equally eager to present and see what your classmates have presented.
