Course Objective: This course is intended to help students build a solid

foundation on basic probability. Such a background is crucial in studying subjects like statistics, A.I., and financial mathematics. Emphases will be placed on developing problem solving skills and a thorough understanding of basic concepts. These concepts include conditional expectations, the law of total probability (problem solving by conditioning), discrete, continuous, and jointly distributed random variables (particularly bivariate normal), transformation of random variables, Jensen's inequality, and limit

theorems.
